The Biodiversity Check for companies in the tourism industry





Relevance of biodiversity for the tourism sector

The loss of biodiversity and climate change are among the greatest and most important challenges of our time. The current rate of species extinction due to anthropogenic causes is 1000 times higher than naturally. Many resources and services vital to human life are produced on the basis of biodiversity and come from already threatened ecosystems.

Companies use these ecosystem services and natural resources in different ways and thus have an impact on nature. Therefore, even if only economic aspects are considered, companies depend on the conservation of biodiversity, as further loss represents a potential risk for the future of many companies. At the same time, a proactive approach to biodiversity conservation can offer new business opportunities.

There is a particularly close link between the tourism sector and biodiversity: Intact natural landscapes and biodiversity are not "assets" of a company, but valuable, limited and basic resources for the main business of the tourism industry. Businesses have many direct and indirect opportunities to reduce their negative impacts on biodiversity and promote its conservation.

The main causes of biodiversity loss are:

- degradation and destruction of ecosystems
- overuse of natural resources
- climate change
- emissions
- invasive alien species

Objectives and procedure of the Biodiversity Check:

The aims of the Biodiversity Check are to enable companies to enter the field of biodiversity management:

- to demonstrate the relationships between companies and biodiversity
- to demonstrate the importance of biodiversity for the company
- identify the company's impact on biodiversity (direct and indirect)
- define possible measures to reduce impacts and protect biodiversity
- motivate the company to integrate biodiversity into the business management system

Who has already implemented the Biodiversity Check?

Global Nature Fund and partners developed the Biodiversity Check in 2008 and since adapted to various industries and corporate situations. To date, around 85 tourism companies, hotels and tour operators in the Dominican Republic, Honduras, Thailand and Germany, as well as a major European tour operator, have implemented the Biodiversity Check.

The Biodiversity Check is a practical tool to take the first steps towards integrating biodiversity into business management. This check enables the company to analyse its current situation with regard to the potential effects and risks of biodiversity. In addition, the Biodiversity Check Basic provides initial recommendations on objectives and measures that could be part of a Biodiversity Action Plan - integrated into the business framework of the company (e.g. an environmental management system or a quality management system).

The Biodiversity Check offers:

- an analysis that corresponds to current environmental management systems (analysis of the current situation)
- the first step towards integrating biodiversity into a company's (environmental) management
- confidential

The Biodiversity Check is:

- no label or certificate
- no detailed analysis of the entire company and its relationship to biodiversity (Environmental Impact Study)
- bo commitment on the part of the company to continue the study

The Biodiversity Check follows the development of an environmental management system. The process follows an established structure in close cooperation with the responsible persons in the company. The different units or departments of the company and their actual or potential impact on biodiversity are analysed taking into account the five main causes of loss mentioned above. The result of the check is a Biodiversity Action Plan that lists practicable actions, identifies priorities and proposes a timetable. This is discussed with the company and, if necessary, further steps are defined.

The following areas are analysed:

- Strategy/Management/Employee Management
- Real estate, assets and real estate
- Purchasing/supply chain
- Leisure activities
- Transport
- Marketing and communication

Criteria for tourism offers responsible for biodiversity and supportive within the framework of the project





The provider guarantees in principle:

- the offer complies with the applicable environmental and social legislation
- in the company, tourists can learn more about the natural resources of the area, habitats, flora and fauna and the greatest threats to biological diversity

In order to avoid and reduce negative impacts on the environment and biodiversity, the provider undertakes to do so,

- define environmental goals and implement them through good environmental management
- to properly dispose of all waste and waste water
- ensure continuous improvement in the reduction of waste, water consumption and energy consumption
- respect closed seasons, e.g. of marine animals, and do not buy and process endangered and protected species
- not to sell any handicrafts of protected and/or endangered species and not to tolerate their sale in the environment of the company
- not to advertise products and services that have a negative impact on nature and do not respect animal welfare
- whenever possible, to purchase and use sustainably produced products from the region, as well as biodegradable products (cleaning agents, garden products, etc.)
- train employees on environmental issues

As a contribution to the restoration and protection of the biological diversity of the destination, the supplier undertakes to do so;

- to inform and sensitize its customers to environmental issues in connection with the destination and its tourist offer
- to contribute with direct measures to the protection of biological diversity: e.g. with projects for the protection of biological diversity, environmental education, offering only products/services with little or no environmental impact

Business and Biodiversity in Central America and the Dominican Republic:

The contribution of tourism sector to the restoration and protection of coastal and marine biodiversity in the Caribbean





Capsule:

In three Caribbean countries – Dominican Republic, Haiti and Honduras – with measures for sustainable tourism, we want to set the basis for the protection of biodiversity and ecosystem services important for the tourism sector. With this project, we want to sustainably develop tourism and the economic potential in these countries and save the means of livelihood for future generations. At the same time, we implement concepts for mangrove and coral reef protection as important tourist attractions and create new, biodiversity-friendly touristic offers.

Project duration: January 2017 to December 2019

Financing partners:

- European Commission via Europe Aid
- German Cooperation GIZ

Support by the European tourism sector:

In the course of the project 50 touristic businesses in the project countries will implement a biodiversity management system and create 20 new touristic offers with the aim of a sustainable use of biodiversity. These activities need to be fostered by the European demand. We want to invite and motivate 10 European tour operators offering tours to the region to include the newly established journeys with special reference to biodiversity into their travel offer. For these purposes, we provide the tour operators with verified information and local contacts and thereby facilitate the access to such touristic offers. A visit to the project areas and tourism offers can also be organized.

Project targets:

- protection and restoration of coral reefs and mangrove forests along the coast of the DR, transfer of technical knowledge to Haiti and Honduras
- improved protection of the environment and biodiversity in hotels and leisure offers
- creation of sustainable tourist offers with special reference to biodiversity protection
- taking into account the conservation of biodiversity in relevant supply chains (agriculture and fishery) of the tourism sector
- establishment of a financial instrument for the tourism sector to support the protection of ecosystems and biodiversity in the Caribbean Sea and coast
- multi-actor involvement for biodiversity protection and fostering the exchange between these

· dissemination of the project results and conclusions in other Central American countries

What do we want to achieve?

- creation of coral gardens to restore coral reefs in DR and Haiti, transfer of technical knowledge to Honduras
- preservation of the coral reefs as hotspots of biodiversity, as well as protection against flooding and other negative impacts of climate change
- strengthening the resilience of coral ecosystems against alobal warming
- awareness raising in the tourism sector and coastal communities for the value of coral reefs and their biocoenosis



- establishment of a participatory monitoring system of coral reefs in the DR
- protection of threatened species: i.a. reduction of invasive alien fish species, protection of marine turtles, cataloguing of whales
- protection of mangroves in the northern part of DR (Montecristi): management plan and measures
- strengthen environmental and biodiversity management in the tourism sector (At least 50 tourism companies implement a biodiversity management system. We will develop a practical handbook.)
- 20 touristic offers focusing on the sustainable use of biodiversity will be newly established
- at least 10 tour operators in the EU offer products from the region that set an example for the protection of biodiversity
- increasing the demand for these offers
- securing a solid position on the international market
- further education for local fishermen to increase their income by means of touristic offers and monitoring of coral reefs
- workshops for banana and other tropical fruit farmers: measures to reduce negative impacts and improve the protection of biodiversity
- three regional working groups on tourism and biodiversity will be established
- action plans for the protection of regional biodiversity
- relevant stakeholders will be involved and committed to implement action plans
- the development of a national ecolabel for tourism offers in DR, as well as a marketing strategy for labelled products will be supported

"OJOS INDÍGENAS" Tourism connected with nature

Keywords: Ecological walkabout, observation of endemic species, swimming in crystalline water

Short description:

The Ojos Indígenas private sanctuary is one of the few of its kind in the Dominican Republic. Here tourists can experience typical forests of the Dominican Republic in the transition between humid coastal forest and tropical rain forest. On 1500 ha, visitors will find a unique landscape with numerous crystal clear lagoons, some of which are even open for swimming. A signposted tour of 2 km length leads through the area. During the tour endemic reptile species like the rhinoceros iguana (in extinction care), forest snakes (non-toxic), chicotas (freshwater turtles) can be observed. Level of difficulty: low

- this is a private nature reserve that promotes ecotourism and offers maximum protection for the biodiversity of the area

DISCOVERING MARINE RESTORATION IN PUNA CANA

Short description:

On this tour the visitors can learn about the techniques of coral restoration carried out by the Punta Cana Group Foundation. Punta Cana has an over 20 km long barrier reef that accompanies the white sandy beaches.

As part of the tourist development of the area, the Punta Cana Group and its foundation work actively on the conservation and restoration of coral reefs.

In the Marine Innovation Center, visitors can get to know the laboratories that reproduce coral species in the Punta Cana reefs.

The tour starts with a visit to the natural pool, where visitors can see techniques to measure and replant corals. The visit is interesting for everyone who want to learn about biodiversity conservation measures.



BIRD WATCHING FOR THE WHOLE FAMILY

Short description:

The Punta Cana Foundation offers a range of ecological tourist activities for the whole family to complement a holiday on the paradisiacal sandy beaches of the Dominican Republic. Guests have access to four ecological tours within the Punta Cana Resort & Club: a visit to the Ojos Indígenas private sanctuary, the bird tower, the marine research centre and the foundation's orchard.

The bird tower is easily accessible and the tour begins at the foundation's "orchard". After 220 meters visitors reach the 4-storey tower, which offers photos and information about birds. The treetops invite to a moment of silence, while visitors can observe numerous native and partly endemic birds.
